A brief description of NFS Structure and positions

Regional foresters

- Lead the land management programs in 9 regions
- Reports directly to the Chief
- Coordinates activities among forests within the region
- Coordinated regional land use planning

Forest Supervisors

- Coordinates activities among districts,
- Allocates budget
- Provides technical support to districts
- Report to regional foresters.



District Rangers

- Manages district level activities
- Reports to the Forest Supervisor
- Directs on-the-ground activities
 - campgrounds,
 - Watershed restoration
 - Trail maintenance
 - Vegetation and wildlife

*Ranger Districts often have the closest connection to local communities and on-the-ground activities.





Strength of the Forest Service- An Engaged Public

2012 Planning Rule

- addresses social and economic sustainability
- ecosystem services
- multiple uses
- social and economic benefits for present and future generations
- required to engage the public "using collaborative processes where feasible and appropriate."

How do we interact with the public?

- public/meetings and workshops
- public comment periods
- targeted outreach efforts to federally recognized Tribes, youth, new audiences, permittees, and neighboring landowners
- Coordination with State governments and other entities
