Photograph 51 is an award-winning play by Anna Ziegler. that opened in 2015. The play focuses on the often-overlooked role of X-ray crystallographer Rosalind Franklin in the discovery of the double helix structure of DNA while working at King's College London. The title comes from *Photo 51*, the nickname given to an X-ray diffraction image taken by Raymond Gosling in May, 1952, under the supervision of Rosalind Franklin.

The OSU Special Collections and Archives Research Center houses Photo 51 in their extensive collection from Linus Pauling who was also working on the structure of DNA. A copy of the famed photograph will be on display.
