Dear Senators and Representatives,

As you know, in August 2016 the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) considered and recommended a consolidated 2017-19 capital request for public universities. In November, the HECC revised its recommended list. The Governor's Recommended Budget contains yet another public university capital list. We respectfully request that the Legislature approve the attached capital list, considered by the HECC in August 2016, with designated requests totaling \$284.39 million. Approving all of the projects on the August list would leverage \$104 million in matching gifts and university resources.

This capital request began with a slate of projects totaling \$614 million. Through a rigorous process that sought to balance Oregon's overwhelming need for deferred maintenance and new investment with campus-specific opportunities and challenges, the university Vice Presidents for Finance and Administration narrowed the list to \$284 million, significantly less than the \$346 million requested in 2015-17. University Boards of Trustees, senior administrations, and wide-ranging campus constituencies then reviewed and approved these projects as the most justifiable investments needed to support and advance student success through the built environment.

We recognize that there are other capital projects that are not on this list, either because they were set aside in our prioritization process or because they were presented after that process occurred. While those projects may each have merit, we believe the projects totaling \$284 million should be prioritized. We also agree that, among the projects listed, the highest priority should be an investment of \$65 million in Capital Improvement and Renewal to be distributed among all seven campuses.

We appreciate the recognition by the HECC and Governor of the need for additional investments in capital assets. Through our partnership with the State, we have been able to keep capital support on pace with enrollment growth over the last decade. Bonding capacity that is dedicated to higher education facilities and infrastructure is just as crucial for student success as operating support.

We look forward to working collaboratively with you this Session in securing the needed funding for capital and operating expenses for Oregon's public higher education institutions.
