

### Foundation English Level Progression

Under the current progression structure, students are required to pass two consecutive sessions of the same course before progressing to the next level (IEPG/IEPH or IEPH/IEPG). In certain cases, level progression will occur in the middle of a term. For progression, Academic Support tracks and determines correct level registration for continuing students.

Progression Example 1: Foundation English to Academic English (single level)

Progression Example 2: Foundation English to Academic English (split level)

	IEPG	IEPH	IEPG	IEPH	IEPA

\*Starting in Spring 2013, progression from GE3 to AE4 will require students to retake placement tests before registering for AE courses.

Progression Example 3: Foundation English to Academic English (split term)

	IEPG	IEPH	IEPG	IEPH	IEPA
LSV	1	2	2	3	3*
RW	1	1	2	2	3
G	1	1	2	2	3

\*In this instance, a student will take a total of 15 weeks of the split term course (5 weeks GE/10 weeks AE).

Progression Example 4: Foundation English to Academic English (two-level split)

	IEPG	IEPH	IEPG	IEPH	IEPG	IEPH	IEPA
LSV	2	2	3* (2)	3	3	4	4^
RW	1	1	2	2	3	3	4^
G	1	1	1	2	2	3	3

\*In this instance, the student cannot progress to LSV3 due to a two-level split with Grammar. The student will progress to LSV3 when he/she progresses to level two in Grammar.

^Starting in Spring 2013, progression from GE3/GE4 to AE4 will require students to retake placement tests before registering for AE courses.
