Students are provided with the foundational knowledge to educate and actively engage their peers in building healthy, safe, empathetic and inclusive communities that mitigate common town-gown issues.

## STEP 2 ELIGIBILITY: OSU CAMPUS AMBASSADOR

Pass AHE 407 and become eligible to become an OSU Campus Ambassador.

Community Ambassadors are peer educators who actively engage students in community building strategies that enhance livability and the quality of life within the off-campus, Corvallis neighborhoods they live. Community Ambassadors liaise with off-campus living groups including, but not limited to, neighborhood associations, city government officials and Greek Life. Community Ambassadors receive training to develop programming and communication that encourages inclusivity, empathy, civic responsibility and positive student-neighbor relationships.
